After an \$11 million bond issue passed last year, the North Pike School District in Summit, MS is making progress on a new upper elementary school adjacent to other school property. This 51,000 square foot facility includes classroom space, computer and media center, gym, cafeteria, kitchen, and administrative offices. The school will be ready for the fall, 2019 session.

Mac's Construction of Hattiesburg is the general contractor for this new building. They have a long history in general construction beginning in 1970. Mac's has worked across the industry spectrum with projects including office buildings, industrial, banking, healthcare, churches and government work. This is Metro's first project with them.

Our work on this school includes six outdoor VRF systems with 42 indoor units, outside air, roof-top package units, and make-up air for the kitchen area. In addition to the HVAC, we are completing all plumbing for this school.

Our work includes construction of a new central plant with two 350-ton chillers, pumps and mechanical piping loop.
