MORE THAN JUST ABCs

The Mid City Campus of BASIS Baton Rouge Primary School is slated for completion just in time for the Fall, 2021 school year. Joining its sister school, Basis B.R. – Materra, this is the latest addition to the tuition-free public charter school system. Basis advertises a "world class education" and uses the teaching pattern of building fundamental concepts at an accelerated pace to prepare students for higher education and beyond.

Buquet & LeBlanc is the general contractor for this facility. The new 43,000 square foot school will feature 27 classrooms, 2 multi-purpose areas, and outdoor and indoor play space serving grades K-5. Metro's work includes installation of 40 roof top units and associated duct and 3 ductless splits.

With growth in the Baton Rouge market, Metro is also opening our fourth office location in east Baton Rouge. This will help serve our customer base and allow for equipment staging and pipe fabrication for local projects. We are excited about having a permanent home base in this area.

ENTERGY



Another prime mechanical project for Metro included the renovation of Entergy's Hot Springs Service Center.

Our work included replacement of an 80-ton chiller, three air handlers, associated duct, piping, electrical and controls. Entergy operates administrative offices, meter reading dispatch, equipment and materials storage out of this facility.

GARY ROAD SCHOOLS



As part of the Hinds County School system, Gary Road Schools are adding multi-use space called Gymatoriums. These spaces can be used for large group meetings or recreational space for students. Coleman Hammons Construction is the general contractor for this addition to both schools. Metro's work includes all HVAC, site and building plumbing.

CAPITOL FACILITIES



Metro crews are installing new computer room equipment on the 700 North State Street building. This is part of the Capitol Complex operated by the MS Department of Finance and Administration. Our work included removal of a roof top unit and replacement with a Stultz computer room unit using dual source cooling of chilled water and DX. This project is scheduled for completion in April.

FORREST GENERAL HOSPITAL



Metro HVAC and plumbing crews are renovating the E Wing at Forrest General Hospital. This work will provide space for a new dialysis unit with 27 patient beds. Metro's scope includes acid waste, medical gas, heating/chilled water piping, new air handlers, 28 VAVs, and exhaust fans. This is one of nine projects presently underway in the Hattiesburg market.
