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MAC HAIK CONTINUES EXPANSION IN THE MISSISSIPPI MARKETPLACE

Mac Haik, one of the best-known dealership names in Central Mississippi, has recently opened a new state-of-the-art Collision Center on I-55 in North Jackson. With more than 20 dealerships across Texas and Mississippi, they represent several brands including General Motors, Ford, and Dodge/Ram/Jeep.

Mac is a native Mississippian, originally from Meridian, a graduate of Ole Miss, and was drafted into the NFL with the Houston Oilers (Texans). His connection to Mississippi and Texas has influenced his commitment to grow businesses in these areas. The Collison Center's motto is "Your interest is our #1 priority."

Peoples Construction was the general contractor for this 40,000 square foot facility. Metro Mechanical installed HVAC and plumbing for this project which included split systems, package units, mini-splits and compressed air piping. The collision center opened in May 2021 for business.

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OCHSNER RIVERCHASE



Ochsner is adding a new pediatric clinic as part of their Northshore area medical services. Donahue Favret is the general contractor for this new construction in the Riverchase development in Covington, Louisiana. Metro Mechanical is completing the HVAC installation which includes new roof top units with VAV/multizone systems, controls, and a separate system for the IT room. This project is scheduled for completion in late summer.

COOPERATIVE ENERGY



Metro Mechanical recently completed work at the headquarters of Cooperative Energy in Hattiesburg, Mississippi. Work included removal of geothermal water source heat pumps and installation of two 50-ton chillers and associated piping. This member-owned electric cooperative serves over 432,000 homes and businesses in 55 of Mississippi's 82 counties. With history dating back to 1941, South Mississippi Electric was renamed Cooperative Energy in 2016.

SOUTHERN TIRE MART



As the #1 commercial tire dealer in North America, Southern Tire Mart continues to expand its footprint across the nation. Metro Mechanical is working on a combination retail and wholesale store in Richland, Mississippi and soon will start another Memphis, Tennessee location. Mac's Construction of Hattiesburg, Mississippi is the general contractor. Our work includes plumbing, split systems for the retail/office area and HVLS fans and wall props for warehouse ventilation. Southern Tire will open this new store in Richland by early fall.

ST. ANDREWS CHAPEL



St. Andrews Episcopal School recently completed the chapel on the main campus in Ridgeland, Mississippi. The new chapel is dedicated to the memory of Rev. Duncan Gray, Jr. who also served as the Honorary Chair for the project. AnderCorp served as the general contractor for this addition to the school. Metro Mechanical furnished all plumbing and HVAC for the building which includes split systems, a dehumidification unit and controls.

Several studies on building maintenance have shown that regular service reduces equipment failure and down time. It improves comfort for the building occupants and reduces energy consumption by improving air flow and efficiency of a clean system. Best of all, you can expect longer life of your HVAC equipment with proper maintenance.

SAFETY CORNER: IMPROVING ON PERFECTION

The idea of perfection is something most of us would not boast as having achieved. No one wants to be perceived as arrogant or seen as claiming to be perfect. MY VIEW: LESSONS LEARNED

The Spanish philosopher, George Santayana (1862-1952), is credited with the saying, "Those who fail to learn from their mistakes are destined to repeat them." Variations on this saying have been repeated by politicians and statesmen over the years.

The previous year of 2020 was a trying time for many across the world. Whether you were in business, education, non-profit, or entertainment, the world shifted and there was little you could do to control such a force.

At Metro Mechanical, we managed projects and service with some minor work stoppages, small virus outbreaks within our team, but for the most part stayed on track. One of the greatest challenges of operating a construction and service business is keeping the pipeline full of future projects. It is agreed that we get stressed with too much or too little backlog. Projects burn off backlog every month and the sales team's goal is to replenish that.

Back to the subject of lessons learned — backlog burn-off suffered about a 50% drop during the second half of 2020. Opportunities to price new work hit the pause button. What does the sales and marketing team do to react to this dilemma?

The following three areas gave us a boost heading into 2021:

- **1** Service opportunities (break and fix/replacement) suffered almost no dip in demand so, we were able to shift resources to this segment.
- We expanded our sales team even before the pandemic was in place.

 They geared up and sought out more leads, customer contacts, and farmed every opportunity.
- Design-build projects stayed on the drawing board (though maybe slower). Shifting from the bid machine to design-build helped jumpstart the new year.

Granted, some things are out of our control. But rather than complaining about the circumstances, we can take action to prepare as the business cycle returns to normal. All of us learned some things over this past year and a half. These lessons will save us from repeating some pitfalls in the future.
